



OVERVIEW

The Henry M. Jackson Foundation for the Advancement of Military Medicine, Inc. (HJF) is the only organization authorized by Congress to support research at the Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences and throughout military medicine. Since 1983, the Foundation has served as a vital link between the military medical community and federal and private partners.

HJF is a dynamic organization committed to meeting the diverse needs of the military medical community. Its research support and administration capabilities allow military medical researchers and clinicians to maintain their scientific focus and to accomplish their goals in a quick and cost-effective manner.

SERVICES

The military medical community has contributed to some of the most significant advances in medical history such as the widespread use of penicillin and development of an effective typhoid vaccine. Research, however, often is accompanied by significant administrative and logistical burdens. HJF provides services to minimize these burdens and facilitate scientific progress.

The Foundation supports more than 1,000 research projects around the world. HJF provides an extensive range of scientific and management services, including infrastructure development, financial administration, clinical trials management, staffing and the coordination of continuing medical education events.

RESEARCH PROGRAMS

HJF provides full support services to single-investigator research projects and many large, multiple-site programs, such as the U.S. Military HIV Research Program, Defense and Veterans Brain Injury Center, Clinical Breast Care Project, Military Amputee Research Program, and Biological Defense Research Directorate.

CLINICAL TRIALS

HJF serves as a vital link between pharmaceutical companies and other private sponsors and the military medical community. The Foundation focuses on minimizing administrative burdens for clinicians by providing clinical trial management services in full compliance with government regulations and sponsor requirements. HJF facilitates Phase I-IV single-site and multiple-site trials using an established network of military medical centers across the country and around the world.

MILITARY MEDICAL EDUCATION

HJF provides a unique service to military institutions by securing and administering funds from private companies to meet non-budgeted educational needs. The Foundation manages more than 800 education accounts, which support medical education opportunities within the military community. These funds are used for activities such as visiting speakers and lecture series, seminars and other educational opportunities.

USU

HJF and USU are partners in progress, working together to advance vital military medical research. HJF supports more than 200 projects at the university, including several large initiatives. Among these programs are the Infectious Disease Clinical Research Program, Center for Disaster and Humanitarian Assistance Medicine, Center for Deployment Psychology and Center for the Study of Traumatic Stress.

PERSONNEL

HJF recruits and retains top scientific and administrative talent. The Foundation specializes in building collaborative teams composed of outstanding researchers, project managers and support staff. Nearly 90 percent of HJF's more than 2,000 employees are in the field, working side by side with military and other federal personnel.

HJF has employees across the United States and in 13 other nations. The Foundation operates in more than 90 locations around the world.
